PUBLIC NOTICE CONCERNING CJA PANEL MEMBERSHIP

The United States District Court for the Eastern District of Arkansas is accepting applications for service on the Criminal Justice Act (CJA) Panel for a three-year term beginning May 17, 2021. The CJA Panel is composed of private attorneys who are authorized to serve as appointed defense counsel pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3006A. In accordance with the Criminal Justice Act Plan for the Eastern District of Arkansas, attorneys must meet the following minimum qualifications to apply for the CJA Panel:

- Be a member in good standing of the Bar of this Court with demonstrated experience in, and knowledge of, the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, the Federal Rules of Evidence, and the Sentencing Guidelines.
- Electronic filing and acceptance of electronic service of orders by CJA Panel attorneys are mandatory.
- Electronic vouchers (via the eVoucher system) are required at both the U.S. District Court and the Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals.
- CJA attorneys are required to submit an annual certification verifying completion of at least six hours of specialized criminal C.L.E. during the twelve-month period ending June 30th. Starting this year, the certification must be submitted electronically via the eVoucher system.
- CJA attorneys will be required to accept one pro bono civil appointment during their three-year term of service.
