ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

Due to a technical error, the Clerk of Court did not mail required paper copies of Court Orders and Notices entered in civil cases between 17 April 2023 and 21 April 2023. All electronic service copies of Orders and Notices were timely served through the Court's CM/ECF system. All paper copies of Orders and Notices in criminal cases were timely mailed by the Clerk.

The Court directs the Clerk to mail the paper copies of the Orders and Notices in civil cases to each affected party immediately and to docket a separate Notice of Delayed Mailing with a copy of this Administrative Order attached.

For good cause, and except as specified below, the Court extends the time by seven calendar days for any party affected by a delayed mailing to do any act that may or must be done within a specified time. Fed. R. Civ. P. 6(b)(1). The Court may not and does not extend the time to act under:

- Fed. R. Civ. P. 50(b) – motion for judgment as a matter of law;
- Fed. R. Civ. P. 50(d) – motion for a new trial;
- Fed. R. Civ. P. 52(b) – motion for amended or additional findings;
- Fed. R. Civ. P. 59(b) & (d) – motion for a new trial;
- Fed R. Civ. P. 59(e) – motion to alter or amend judgment; and
- Fed. R. Civ. P. 60(b) – motion for relief from a judgment or order.

In addition, the Court does not extend the time for filing any notice of appeal. Fed. R. App. P. 4(a)(1). Extensions to file a notice of appeal, or to reopen the time to file a notice of appeal, are governed by Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 4(a)(5) & (6). Finally, the Court does not extend the time prescribed by any scheduling order. And, in any case, the presiding Judge may enter any further order about deadlines that the Judge decides is needed in the circumstances presented.
